A Note from Pastor Matt ...

This past month, I had two amazing experiences with my family. At the beginning of the month, we were well into our trip to Colorado, Utah, Arizona, and New Mexico. It was an amazing trip full of laughs and memories, and I was awestruck by the immense beauty of God's creation.

Just a week after we got back, Ashleigh, Miriam, and I headed off to Lutheridge for camp. Miriam participated in Pioneer A for the last time before she heads to middle school-aged camps next summer, and Ashleigh and I were at Kairos Confirmation Camp learning about Holy Week. It was a fantastic time for all of us, and we can't wait to go back next year.

What struck me the most between these two incredible weeks was that while we were out west, we were able to hear of the history and practices of the ancient Puebloan people and how their descendants continue to tell their beautiful stories. We went to the Cliff Dwellings at Mesa Verde National Park (and numerous other sites of these fascinating people in and around the Four Corners area) and were told that these sites are not *abandoned* nor are they considered *ruins*. Instead, they are parts of the great story of this wonderful people who continue to live in different parts of that area.

It got me thinking about the stories that are shared, the songs that are sung, and the laughs and memories that are had and made at Lutheridge. Each year is *very* different from the one before. Practices and 'norms' change with each generation, but the stories of faith and God's work are still very much alive year in and year out. Those stories that are central to our faith and life. Those stories that fill us with hope and remind us of who and whose we are. Those stories that tell of the promise, presence, and love of God for each of us and all of creation.

Those stories help continue the light and life of our faith. Reminding us again and again that God is with us, just as God always has been throughout the history of creation. We *get* to not only hear those stories, but also to tell and share those stories as well!

These ancient stories of Abraham, Moses, Miriam, Jacob, Joshua, and more continue to burn brightly, challenge us today, and inspire us to see where God is still at work. It's one of the main reasons why I've enjoyed teaching the Bible at Newberry College this past year and next semester and why I've enjoyed walking with folks through the Old Testament here at Redeemer this summer.

Keep telling those stories. Those stories, those places, and more are alive with the spirits of our ancestors in the faith. Telling and hearing those stories helps keep that flame of love close to our hearts as we see God at work in the world!

Tell the stories y'all. Always! Amen!
