Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings from Magoye in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour.

Re: A WORD OF THANKS IN APPRECIATION FOR THE ROLE YOU HAVE PLAYED IN REALIZING THE FARM EQUIPMENT PROJECT

On behalf of the ELCT SWD Executive Council, a constitutional body of our diocese that got officially informed of your contribution as a result of which procurement of a brand new 75HP Massey Ferguson Tractor, numerous implements for efficient crop production and settlement of other associated costs including shipping, transportation to Magoye and shed construction has been made possible, I wholeheartedly thank you for your love to the women of South Western Diocese and the community we are serving as a church at large.

We actually consider it to be your gift of love to us and the entire community because you could have invested or spent your money on other things for your private gain or return. Your investment in this project means a lot not only to women but also to the entire community we are serving bearing in mind that efficient crop production will result into improved livelihood at household level through improved income due to sale of crops produced in excess. On the other hand, economic well being at household level is expected to have a significant contribution in enabling parents to take their children to school with no fear of being unable to pay school fees. As a church, we expect a rise of income through offerings with which we will be able to carryout mission work further.

Having been made aware that our shipment will arrive at the Dar es salaam port on 01st November 2024, I bring to your attention that three of us from the head office namely Rev. Dr. Naibu Nyambo who serving in the capacity of Planning and Development Coordinator, our General Secretary, Geofrey Ngogo and I will leave Magoye for Dar es salaam on 04th November 2024 for settlement of port protocols in connection to the shipment and arrangement of container transportation to Chimala and finally Magoye.

We will provide you with updates in this regard accordingly.
