#### A Note from Pastor Matt ·

Grace and peace to each of you as we enter the month of November. November is full within our world and culture. Especially this year. Not only do we get to celebrate and remember All Saints Sunday (November 3), but we also get to celebrate Thanksgiving with our friends and family. Most years, interspersed with fall festivals, pumpkins, and tons of food is usually enough to fill anyone's plate or schedule. However, that is not the only thing we do this month.

That other part that we get to participate in this year is our elections, especially our opportunity to elect our next president. Now, don't worry, I'm not going to request you to vote for any candidate in particular. I'd be wary of any religious leader imploring you to vote one way or another. However, if you'd like to talk to me about who I would vote for, I'd be more than happy to share that.

Though, I do have one simple ask as you head to the polls this month. Remember who and whose you are.

The Congregation Council conducted a review of our standing committees and made some updates during our August meeting. We have decided to divide the duties of the Community Compassion committee into Evangelism and Social Ministry and to move the 1853 Committee to our Constitution and By Laws. The Congregation Council can update the Continuing Resolutions portion of our Constitution, but needs the Congregation's approval for updates to the Constitution and By Laws sections. In 2025, we will be updating the Constitution and By Laws following the ELCA Churchwide Assembly the late summer of 2025. Watch for more information about this endeavor and if you would like to serve on that committee, please let Ben Bowers know. We will also be updating our committee list for 2025 and ask you to prayerfully consider an area of our church's ministries in which you might serve.

The *Evangelism Committee* shall devote itself to deepening the spiritual life of the congregation and our community. COMMITTEE

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of the upcoming annual meeting on November 10th, 2024. The meeting will immediately follow the church service.

The agenda will be a light one, with voting taking place for new members to the Congregation Council, Endowment Committee, and the Nominating Committee as well as voting on the Ministry Spending Plan for 2025.

The nominations for a three-year term on Council (four vacancies) are: Mack Garner, Corbett Miller, and Zoe Reid. As of the writing of this letter, one more name is needed and nominations can be made from the floor.

The nominations to fill two vacancies for a three-year term on the Endowment Committee are: Benny Ferguson and Eve Kneece.

As a reminder, nominations can be made from the floor to add names to the ballot for any of the above offices. Anyone nominated from the floor must either be present to accept the nomination or have previously agreed to have their name added.

The last agenda item will be a vote to approve the 2025 Ministry Spending Plan. The proposed budget is included in the newsletter for your review. You are encouraged to bring a copy with you to the meeting.

A goal for the 2025 year is to get our committees more active to improve all the programs and involvement of our members, both in the church as well as in the community. I encourage everyone to prayerfully consider the role you can play in bringing this goal to fruition.

# Redeemer WELCA News -


