• **New Members**: We welcomed thirteen new members into our community. Many of them cited Redeemer's intentional focus on being a place of welcome and love for all as a significant reason for wanting to join.

• **Baptisms**: We celebrated the baptisms of four children and youth, rejoicing in their welcome into the family of Christ.

•Youth Ministry Growth: Our youth program continues to flourish! Recent gatherings have drawn over ten youth from our church and community. We've also partnered with other area churches in Newberry, Prosperity, and Clinton for combined youth activities throughout the year.

• **Music Ministry**: Under the leadership of Nicholas Shumate, our choir has grown both in size and strength. Truly, we have a one-of-a-kind church choir in Newberry, and their contributions continue to enrich our worship.

• Service Ministries: Our acts of service have shone God's love in countless ways – through Angel Ministry, GAAP, Manna House, partnering with Newberry College, prayer cards, knitters, serving meals with the Salvation Army, donating items for those impacted by Hurricane Helene, and so much more. Together, we have shown what it means to be the hands and feet of Christ in the world.

• **Generosity in Giving**: This year's giving has been a cause for celebration. Those who pledged to increase their contributions for 2024 raised their giving by an average of 35%, demonstrating their faith and commitment to our shared mission.

Truly, this is a place where God is at work.

Of course, 2024 also brought its share of challenges. We are seeking ways to address our roof repairs, praying for healing amid hurt and division within local church communities, and mourning the loss of five beloved members of our church family. In all of this, we continue to hold one another in arms of care, grace, and love – just as God holds each of us through the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Christ our Lord.

This month's featured committee is the Worship and Music Committee.

It shall be the function of this committee to assist the Congregation Council in seeing that the services of God's house are conducted regularly and in accordance with the liturgy of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, that ushers are recruited and trained, and that hymnals and other devotional materials are provided and properly cared for. This committee shall supervise and strive to advance the welfare and effective service of the choirs of the congregation. It shall arrange for the care of paraments, vestments and musical instruments and, in consultation with the Pastor, the organist, the choir director(s), it shall furnish music supplies appropriate for use in the worship of a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. With the Pastor, the Worship and Music Committee shall assist this church's music ministry.

The Worship and Music Committee has started a new group, The Pew Crew. This group will meet once a week to go through the pew racks and make sure the hymnals, Bibles, pencils, offering envelopes, and other supplies are maintained and orderly for our worship services. When we have funerals or weddings, there may be a need for additional maintenance.

There is always a need for additional people to assist with other areas of our worship ministry: worship assistant, acolyte/crucifer, usher, and communion preparation.
